This program allows schools who are not in a position to hire full time school psychologists to build in school psychology services to their student support program. A retainer agreement with Linden enables schools to plan ahead for regular visits from a school psychologist who can be integrated as an on-going member of your student support team. 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Core Retainer Services

- Guaranteed scheduling: may be planned up to one year in advance, as desired
- 2 - 3 educational psychologists assigned to the school
- Weeklong assessment visits with one psychologist (two psychologists for double services) that may flexibly include:
 - **3 full assessments OR**
 - **2 full 2 brief OR**
 - **1 full 4 brief**
- Linden educational psychologists will offer teacher consultations or office hours during each visit
- Reports completed approximately 5-6 weeks after visit
- Follow-up meetings on-line via video conference or at the next site visit

Additional benefits

- 1 morning/ afternoon office hour block with ongoing support for teachers and follow up sessions
- Psychologist attendance at Student Support Services meetings as needed
- Tele-assessments in cases of school closures, immunocompromised students, or travel restrictions
- Support with building ILPs/ IEPs
- 1-2 mini workshops/year for small groups of staff on topics such as Functional Behavioral Analyses, How to Interpret a Psychoeducational Report, Executive Functioning, etc.
- Virtual Occupational Therapy Assessments and Screeners (additional costs)

BASIC SUPPORT

Schools refer families to Linden. Families enroll and pay for services including travel costs 4 weeks prior to visit.

STANDARD SUPPORT

Families enroll and pay for services. School covers travel and accommodation fees. Guaranteed commitment for visit regardless of family prepayments for travel cost.

FULL SUPPORT

Linden specialists are a direct extension of school staff. Services, travel & accommodation paid by the school, but costs may be passed on to families internally.

SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY SERVICES ASSESSMENT PROCESS FOR SCHOOLS




STEP 1:

Choose your retainer package of 12, 8, 6, 4 or 2 visits a year



STEP 2:

Linden assigns 2-3 dedicated educational psychologists to your school



STEP 3:

Coordinate your yearly assessment schedule. Scheduling may be planned up to one year in advance.



STEP 4:

Allocate students for scheduled assessment weeks



STEP 5:

Linden School Psychologist communicates with parent and teachers to prepare for assessment



STEP 6:

Linden School Psychologist travels to your school for 5 days for assessments, observations, parent meetings, and teacher consultations



STEP 7:

Reports will be completed approximately 6 weeks after each visit. Linden School Psychologists provide in-depth teacher and parent consultations and thorough, teacher-friendly, and easily applicable reporting.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Q: How do I know if my student needs a brief or full assessment?

A full assessment is best if it is the first time a student is being evaluated, or if there are complex needs for a re-evaluation. A brief assessment may be appropriate for a re-assessment or if only one area of functioning needs to be evaluated (e.g., only cognitive OR academic scores needed, only social-emotional assessment needed, etc.). We are able to be quite flexible and are happy to discuss your individual students' needs to help you determine what kind of assessment is best!



Q: What is the testing session like?

Our psychologist will work with the student over 1-4 testing sessions lasting from 1-3 hours, depending on the needs of the student. During this time, they will work on various activities, puzzles, and game-like tasks. Most students are quite engaged in this process and often seem to enjoy it!



What do you do besides working directly with the student during the testing session?

We pride ourselves on providing comprehensive reports that include not only information from the testing sessions, but from important stakeholders in the student's education. We conduct parent and teacher interviews, classroom observations when appropriate, and send questionnaires to be completed by parents and teachers.



What do we get out of the assessment?

After the assessment is complete, the psychologist will provide the parents with a detailed report. The report is typically 10-20 pages in length, depending on the referral question, and includes at least 2 pages of detailed recommendations for how to help the child succeed in school and at home. Once the parents are able to review the report with the psychologist, a copy is provided to the school with parent permission.



What does the school need to do to prepare for an assessment trip?

Our psychoeducational assessment coordinator will work with a school liaison to determine testing dates. All we ask is that the school send families our way to begin the process of getting set up for assessment, and ensure there is a quiet space set aside for testing.
